



Prayer Ministry at the House of the Lord

At the House of the Lord we value prayer. We know that we have been called to be a House of Prayer for all nations as individuals and corporately. We realize that our effectiveness in ministry is directly linked to how we live in this identity of being a House of Prayer. Therefore, we have a few practical ways our prayer ministry at the House of the Lord gives people the opportunity to be involved:

- 1) Prayer Ministry Team at services—These people pray before services and also are available to pray for individuals who come up for prayer during or after the service.
- Monday Night Intercession Group @7pm—This is a group specifically for those who feel called to intercession and also to be trained up as intercessors.
- 3) Tuesday Night Power Prayer meetings @7pm—This is a group where, through prayer and worship, we see breakthrough in individual lives, families, our church, our city, and the nations.
- 4) Friday Morning Men's Prayer Meeting @5am-where men get together online and in person to pray for each other, encourage each other, and pray for various prayer requests.
 - 5) Various other prayer and worship events to unite the Body of Christ and get people to pray together to see God's kingdom come and His will being done here on earth as it is in heaven.
 - 6) The BHOP Prayer Chapel can be used at any time 24/7 to spend time praying at. The code is freely given to anyone who would like access to the Chapel to pray.



Prayer Ministry Team for Services

- 1) Join the Prayer Ministry Team Telegram Group
- Come pray before Sunday Services between 7am-8am in the BHOP Prayer Chapel or pray at home before coming to church
- Believe God for specific words for our church service or specific needs that we need to pray for during our service that morning
- 4) Post these words on the Telegram Group so that the preaching pastor or relevant person will have access to the words and use them as he/she is led by the Holy Spirit
 - 5) Be ready at any point during the service to pray for people as requested by the pastor



Guidelines for Prayer Team During Services

- 1) Pray before showing up
 - 2) Dress Modestly
- 3) Be a willing and clean vessel for God to use
- 4) Find someone the same gender as you to pray for
 - 5) Don't stand in someone's personal space
 - 6) Ask if they need specific prayer for something
- 7) Ask if you can lay your hands on them when praying
 - 8) Pray with confidence, but don't shout
 - 9) Don't pray excessively long prayers
- 10) Ask God for a word for the person you are praying for
 - 11) Remember this is not a counseling session
- 12) Do not force anything on the person being prayed for
 - 13) Allow the Holy Spirit to work through you
 - 14) Believe for God to do something in this moment
